World Day of Prayer for Vocations...

May 7 is the 43rd World Day of Prayer for Vocations. It was back in 1963 that Pope Paul VI designated the fourth Sunday of Easter, the feast of the Good Shepherd, as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

In his message for this year's World Day of Prayer for Vocations, Pope Benedict XV invites the People of God to meditate on the theme "Vocation in the Mystery of the Church," and issues a call to pray "for vocations to the priesthood and the consecrated life." Our Lady of Fatima...

The first apparition of Our Lady took place around noon on Sunday, **May 13, 1917**, when a brilliant flash of lightning drew the attention of three young Portuguese children in a field called the Cova de Iria, near the small village of Fatima. A beautiful Lady appeared clothed in white and asked the children to return the 13th of each month. In these apparitions, Mary asked the children to pray the Rosary daily for the conversion of sinners and asked for devotion to her Immaculate Heart. She asked for prayer, penance and that Russia be consecrated to her Immaculate Heart. She also spoke of observing the first Saturdays of each month by going to confession and receiving Holy Communion to make reparation to the Hearts of Jesus and Mary.



Revisit The 19th Century...

The Incredible Race is Coming...

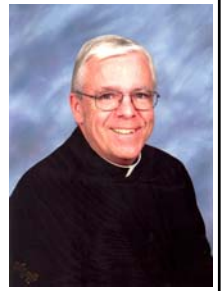

Students at the parish school were learning about Jesus and His role as the Good Shepherd. Liturgy Corner...

Church Interior

On the inside, Catholic church buildings look different from one another, but they have many common features. On walking through the door of a church, you should be able to notice several things.

Narthex: Many churches bring you first into a narthex or gathering area. There you can meet other people or view bulletins and posters.

Nave: The body of the church is the nave. The word is related to "navy" because a church interior somewhat resembles a ship. The congregation assembles in the nave.

Sanctuary: The place where most of the action takes place is the sanctuary. It is set apart from the nave by its height and spaciousness. The three principal furnishings of the sanctuary are the chair, where the priest stands to begin the service; the ambo, where the Liturgy of the Word unfolds; and the altar, the center of the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Choir: There may be another area designated for musicians. In older churches, musicians entered a loft behind the congregation because they created music to be heard, not shared. Today a choir area is more commonly visible to the entire assembly, so the musicians can better lead everyone in singing.

Sacristy: The vessels, vestments, and other items needed for Mass are stored in one or more sacristies. These are not readily visible when you enter a church, but they are essential for the smooth flow of worship.

Other items: Statues, stations of the cross, votive candles, the tabernacle, and other items may be seen in the church. These occupy devotional areas that are not essential for the celebration of the Mass, but they are part of the environment one customarily sees on entering a Catholic church.

Through Stewardship we can facilitate a spiritual process whereby parishioners, as recipients of God's varied graces (gifts), would be given and, as stewards, each is called to return those gifts in service to his/her family, the parish, our community, the diocese, and the wider universal Church and community. The parish, like a family, becomes the primary extension through which parishioners have the opportunity to live and carry out our parish's stewardship theme "We are Family—with a Giving Lifestyle."

The effectiveness of the stewardship process cannot be judged solely on the basis of financial results and volunteer commitments. Stewardship is spiritually based; the results will be in the hearts of those who are responding to the call. Stewardship results in more enthusiasm, increased joy, deeper individual involvement, commitment, and positive attitude, which over time, provides quantitative results.

Jesus desired to give His life away. The image of the Good Shepherd in today's Gospel is one of a man who boldly shows us this desire. Unfortunately, too often, the pastoral image of the Good Shepherd has been translated into art depicting a placid, easy-going shepherd who holds the lost lamb and is followed by a flock of docile sheep.

Fortunately, today's gospel shows anything but passivity. This shepherd is ready to lay down his life for the sheep. This is a person who takes his responsibility seriously. For the shepherd, the sheep are his life and he is ready to lay down his life for them. The Good Shepherd is the credible leader because he puts his life on the line.

Who would not want to follow that kind of leader? That person is both dependable and decisive. This is why Peter and John were so effective in the passage from the Acts of the Apostles.

At Baptism, we inherited the same Spirit that moved within Jesus and His apostles. How have you taken ownership of that Spirit? How have you allowed the Spirit to move you to take a leadership role within our parish community? The Spirit was given to us to encourage us, and give us courage. Act with courage!



Ministry for Social Action...

This week we review another encyclical on social justice.

QUADRAGESIMO ANNO (Reconstruction of the Social Order)

Author: Pope Pius XI **Date:** May 1931

Innovation: Introduces the concept of "subsidiarity," problems should try to be resolved on a local level first.

Place in History: 1914-18 World War I; 1917 Russian Revolution; 1920 First full-time session of the League of Nations; 1925, Hitler published *Mein Kampf*; 1929, Great Depression.

Context: A response to the Great Depression, which rocked the world. In Europe, democracy had declined and dictators emerged to take power. It is four years after *Rarum Novarum*.

Points:

- After detailing the positive impact *Rarum Novarum* had on the social order – through the church, civil authorities and now flourishing unions – stresses that a new situation warrants a new response.
- Charges that capital's free competition has destroyed itself, with the state having become a "slave" to its greed.
- While the lot of workers had improved in the Western World, it had deteriorated elsewhere.
- Warns against a communist solution, though, because communism condones violence and abolished private property.
- Labor and capital need each other. A just wage is necessary so workers can acquire private property.
- The state has the responsibility to reform the social order, since economic affairs can't be left to free enterprise alone.
- Public intervention in labor-management disputes approved.
- International economic cooperation approved.

Trivia: *Quadragesimo anno* expands *Rarum Novarum*'s focus on poor workers to include the structures that oppress them.
