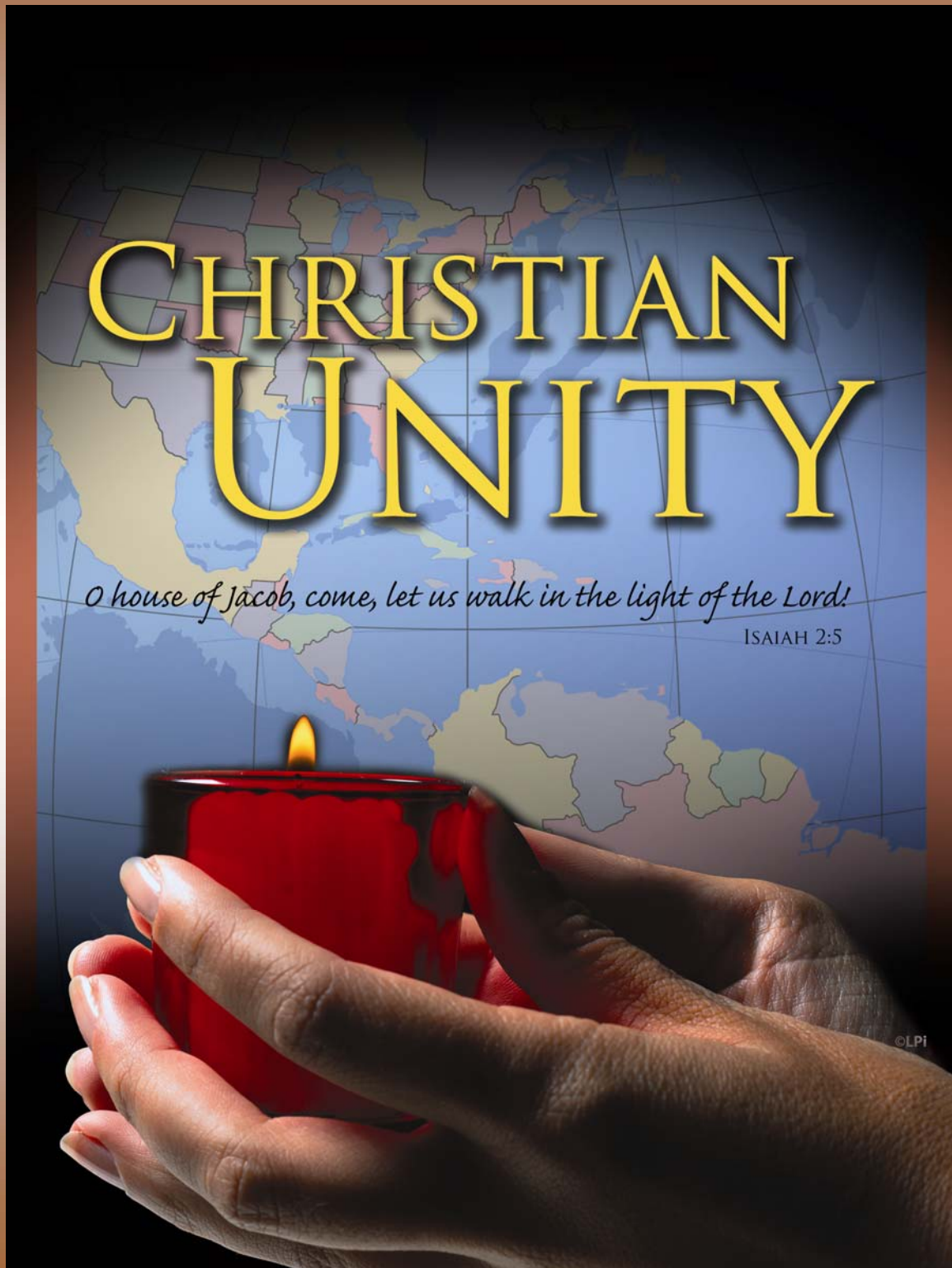

## Pastor's Corner...

We see people, not as they are, but as we are. This weekend's Gospel provides us with an illustration of this truth. Jesus has only recently arrived from Nazareth. He was completely unknown. He needed someone to introduce him to the public and so launch Him on His public mission. He found that person in John the Baptist.

One day, shortly after He has baptized Jesus, John saw Jesus passing by. Turning to his disciples, John said, "There is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. This is the one I spoke of when I said: A man is coming after me who ranks before me ..." With these words, John introduces Jesus to his own disciples and to the public, and opened the way for Him.

These words tell us a lot about the identity and mission of Jesus. Jesus was that Servant whose coming was foretold by Isaiah, and whose mission was to bring sinners back to God. But, these words also tell us a lot about the kind of person Jesus was.

John could have ignored Jesus, or criticized Him. But, instead, he pointed Him out to the people; he built Him up before them. He does not see Him as a threat, but as a friend and ally. John facilitated the start of

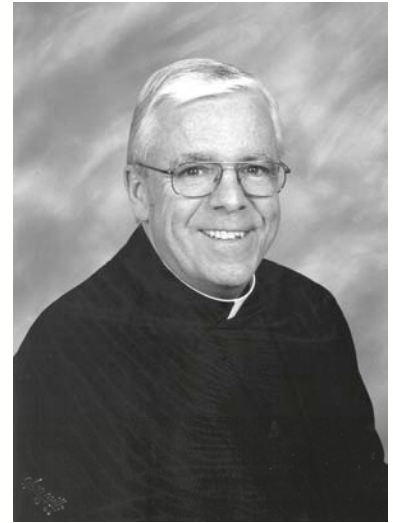
Jesus' mission. This shows what a good and generous man John was.

There is an important lesson here for you and me. If we are always finding fault with other people, always putting people down, we should look at ourselves. We may be saying more about ourselves than about other people. Once our hearts are open to others, we discover good in them, even when it is hidden.

Jesus is the supreme example of this. How did He get sinners to change their way of life? He did so, not by condemning them and keeping His distance from them, but by befriending them. He believed in them. He saw goodness in them. He put them in touch with their own goodness. Through His own goodness, He evoked goodness in them.

Jesus befriends us also. He puts us in touch with our own goodness. And once we are in touch with our own goodness, we will find goodness in others and help to bring out that goodness.

This weekend we begin the annual Charity and Development Appeal for the Diocese of Phoenix. I pray that you will pray about this very successful and worthy appeal and that you will be as generous as you can. Next week we will be given an opportunity to fill



out pledge cards and will learn several ways in which we can participate. Begin this week by praying about it. God is very generous with us. This is our opportunity to be generous to others in need.

Have a great week everyone. Let's take this week's message and put it into action. Look for the goodness in those around you, especially your so called enemies. You might be surprised what you find.

As we enter into ordinary time in the liturgical year we are called to see beneath life's surface. ## Ministry for Social Action...

In keeping with our focus on parish-based Foster Care Support Ministry, we reflect on the Crisis Nursery whose mission is to break the cycle of child abuse and neglect by providing emergency shelter and support services to children from birth to age ten. Right in our community, Crisis Nursery serves over 100 children every day through two programs.

**Children's Shelter & Marcus House** – provides housing and support services for up to 41 children ages birth to 10 years old who are at risk of abuse, neglect or abandonment. Medical attention, clothing, nutritious food, and a safe place to live are provided in conjunction with nurturance, consistency, and a stimulating daily routine.

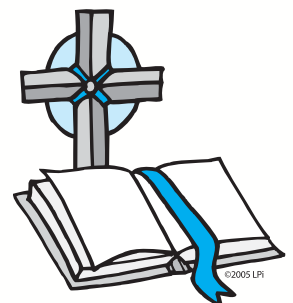
**FACES (Families and Children Experiencing Success) Program** – provides childcare and early childhood education for children age 1-5 who demonstrate delays, or whose home environments pose continuing risks to their healthy growth. In-home parenting skills training and family support services including crisis intervention and community services referrals are also provided.

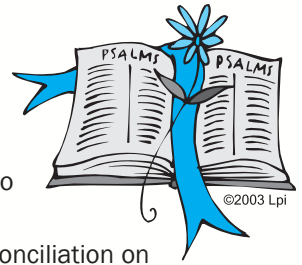

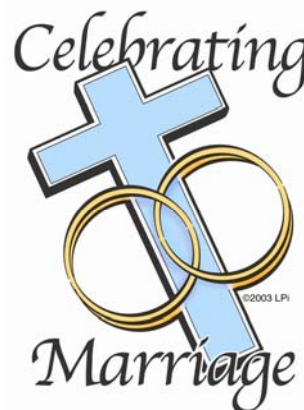
