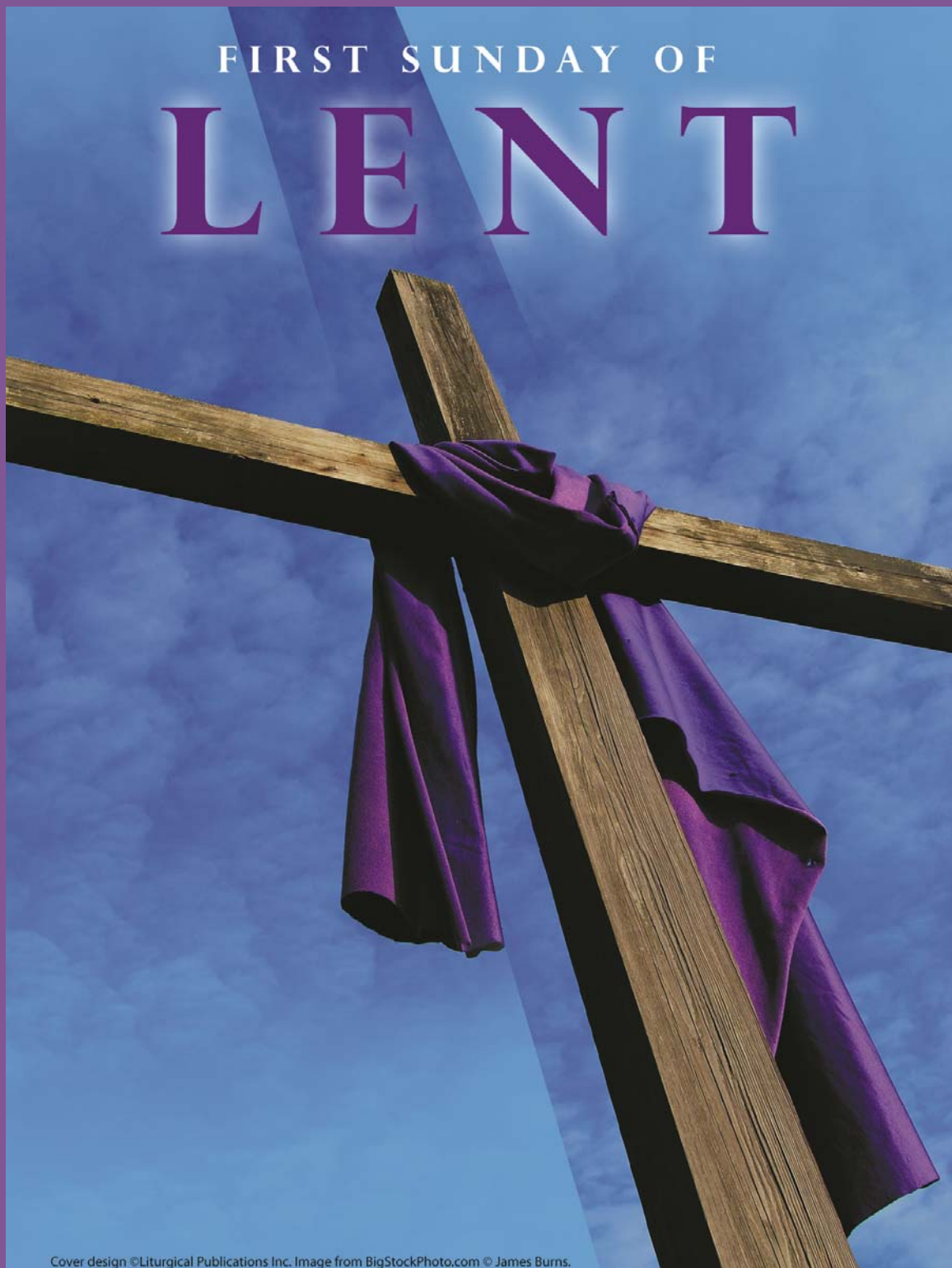

2011 Lenten Alms Giving

Parishioners and visitors are invited to share in alms giving (in-kind gifts, money, and/or gift certificates) during Lent. Please bring your alms to Church and place them in the Sanctuary next to the Baptismal Font; or you can bring them to the Soup Kitchen each Tuesday during Lent. Everyone is invited to partake of the homemade soups on Tuesdays.

March 13 - First Sunday of Lent

Theme: Desert (Homelessness)

Recipient: *Save the Family Foundation - of Arizona* - Empowers families to conquer homelessness and achieve life-long independence.

Needs: Household items: bedding, cleaning supplies, cooking utensils, dishes, glasses, pillows, pots, pans, silverware, towels, paper towels, toilet paper; Baby items: diapers, powder, oil, shampoo, wipes, instant formula.

Tues Soup Kitchen Hosts: Musician and Choir Ministries

March 20 - Second Sunday of Lent

Theme: All the Communities of the Earth Shall find a Blessing in Him.

Recipient: *Saint Vincent de Paul*

Pastor's Corner...

The story of the fall of Adam and Eve, and the story of the tempting of Jesus, are two very sophisticated stories. They are essentially about making choices.

Before the fall, Adam and Eve had no choice. It was as if they were programmed to do the will of God. They had no sense of being responsible for their actions and choices. They knew no such thing as remorse or regret. But then they had no sense of well-being at doing the right thing, either. They were no better than the animals, which live not by choice, but by instinct.

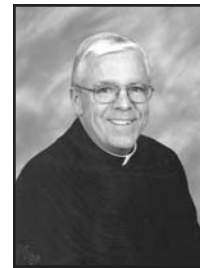
But then God gave them the freedom to choose. In so doing He made it possible for them to be moral, that is, to choose freely to do what is right. Now they have the opportunity to live by choice, to live consciously. They had the freedom to say "yes" or "no" to God. Unfortunately they abused that freedom. To choose evil is to abuse freedom.

In the desert Jesus was faced with the same choice as that which faced Adam and Eve; to do His own will or to do the will of God. Unlike Adam and Eve He made the irrevocable decision to do God's will rather than His own.

But we might say, "Ah, it was easy for Jesus!" It wasn't easy for Him. He also had to struggle to do the will of God. He was wholly human. This doesn't mean that He was merely human. The fact that He was "without sin" did not imply any lack of humanness. Sin is not an intrinsic part of humanness.

Every day we are faced with choices: to do good or to evil, to choose for or against God. It's clear that we have in us a strain of rebelliousness, of self-centeredness, of short-sightedness, which causes us to make the wrong choices, and leads to self-destructive behavior.

The fact that Jesus won an important victory in the desert didn't mean that the war was over. There would be other attacks. Every choice in life must be re-made, perhaps many times. However, every right choice makes the next right choice easier. If we do the right thing often enough, eventually it becomes second nature to us. The real punishment for a sin is that it makes it more likely that we will commit the same sin the next time.



There is in every human heart a longing for the lost Eden and the lost Paradise. Jesus recalls us to our lost childhood. He recalls us to the source of our beginning. No matter how old we may be, He makes it possible for us to be reborn in innocence of character.

A PRAYER ALL OF US CAN SAY:

Dear Lord, so far to day I've done all right: I haven't gossiped; lost my temper; been greedy, grumpy, nasty, selfish or overindulgent.

I'm very thankful for the kind of day You have given me. But in a few minutes, Lord, I'm going to get out of bed and from then on I'm going to need a lot more help! Amen.

Make it a good Lent. Do the best you can. Give what you can to the Lord, especially your heart. Easter will have a whole new meaning! You'll see!

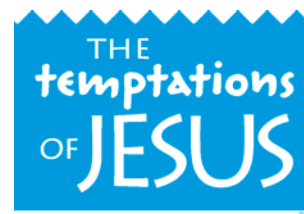

Reflection Corner...

With a history of over two thousand years of Christianity, the followers of Jesus today don't have many stumbling blocks to believing in Him as God. Most Christians simply grow up with that understanding. It becomes a part of our common view of who Jesus is. In our day, it may be more difficult to thoroughly comprehend the other aspect of Jesus' nature: that He was fully and completely human, or as Eucharistic Prayer 4 states it, "He shared our human nature in all things but sin." If that is truly the case (and as Catholics, we believe that it is), then Jesus was subject to all of the temptations and opportunities for sin that we ourselves experience.

Sunday's Gospel about the temptations of Jesus often gets analyzed through an approach that looks for symbolic meaning in the three encounters between Jesus and the devil. That can be one way of examining the story. But as we begin Lent, it might be good to take a more general view that simply presents Jesus as a man struggling against temptation. That is what we do each and every day. In that, He was just like us. He overcame temptation by understanding God's will for Him. That sounds like a pretty good plan for our Lent as well.

The tempter approached and said to Him, "If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread." He said in reply, "It is written: One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God." - Mt 4:3-4

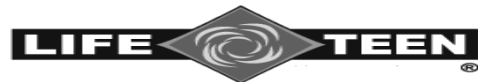
