Pastor's Corner...

On this 5th Sunday in Lent we will have two sets of scriptures. For those preparing for the Easter Sacraments, we hear the story of the raising of Lazarus from the dead -Cycle A. The rest of us will hear the gospel story on the miraculous catch of fish and the call of Peter to share in the work of Christ -Cycle C. In past years we have heard the "A" reading as we wanted, as a parish, to journey with those in preparation. The Liturgy Committee decided that we haven't had a chance to hear the "C" reading and they wanted to give us the benefit of the rich message given to us during this Lent.

In the Gospel of Luke, Peter and his companions had done their best. They had fished all night but had caught nothing. They were now tired and disappointed as they washed their nets.

It is possible to do ones best, yet at the end of the day to have nothing to show for it. One might study hard for an exam, yet not get the desired result. One might play one's heart out, yet lose the match. One might do one's best to be a good parent, yet the child strays for the right path.

Jesus did not blame Peter and his companions. But He didn't encourage them to wallow in self-pity either. Nor did He allow them to rest in failure. He challenged them to try again: "Launch out into the deep and let down your nets for a catch."

Each of us has inside ourselves a greater possibility. There is in each of us a chamber, or closet, that has never been opened. If we are to realize this "greater possibility," we need to be challenged to go beyond ourselves, beyond what we think we are capable of and have settled for. We need someone to say to us, "Launch out into the deep."

Jesus knew that Peter was a sinner. But he knew

that he was also capable of greatness. Many cults appeal to people's weaknesses. But Jesus appealed, not to Peter's weakness, but to this strength. He knew that Peter and his companions were capable of better things. So He threw down a challenge to him - to leave their nets and become fishers of men. And, to their credit, they responded wholeheartedly. They left everything and became His first disciples.



We all need someone who accepts us for what we are, but who believes we are capable of more, and challenges us to realize it.

"From success to failure is one step. From failure to success is a long road." (Yiddish saying)

Thank you to all who have contributed to the Charity and Development Appeal so far. We are doing well, but the race is not over yet. The finish line is in sight ,but we need everyone's help to finish the race. Even \$5, \$10, \$20 gets us closer to the goal but, more importantly, helps those in need during the serious financial crisis our country is in. Please pray about it if you have not joined the "race." Help the homeless, the elderly, the infirm, the children and the unborn. A little gift can go a long way to serve those in need.

But, more importantly, let's pray for those in need, especially in our own parish community who need help. Prayer is powerful. Prayer can bring hope.

Lent is almost over, but not over yet. Renew your intentions every day. Easter is coming. Let us prepare with renewed hearts.

Liturgy Corner..

Once again we have a well-known and familiar Gospel story proposed for our Lenten reflection. The account of the woman caught in the act of adultery is something that we can all relate to. She was found out-discovered-publicly shamed. It happens to most of us at some point in our lives, usually when we are young. We do something wrong, and get caught. And then we have to endure the humiliation of our wrongful act being known by others. It is expected that we will learn from our mistakes, but that doesn't always happen.

On the other hand, we're sometimes like the scribes and the Pharisees who bring the accusation. We discover something we can hold against another. Occasionally it is a secret knowledge that can fester in our hearts. At other times, it is a public shame that we do not hesitate to propagate for our own advantage. For whatever reason-vengeance, jealousy, mean-spiritedness-we want offenders to "get what's coming to them."

Maybe in the end, the story of the woman caught in adultery is to invite us to be neither sinner nor judge. Maybe the point of the story is to act like Jesus. Could we put ourselves in his role? He extends mercy, but he also proposes expectations ("do not sin anymore").

These past three Sundays before Holy Week have been about God giving us time. The fig tree that was allowed to grow another year, the prodigal son who was allowed to come back home, and the woman who was not condemned, were all given another chance. We all want that second chance when we sin. This Sunday's Gospel would suggest if we're going to follow Christ, we have to give another chance to those who sin against us as well.

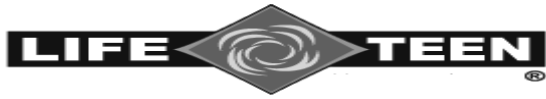
