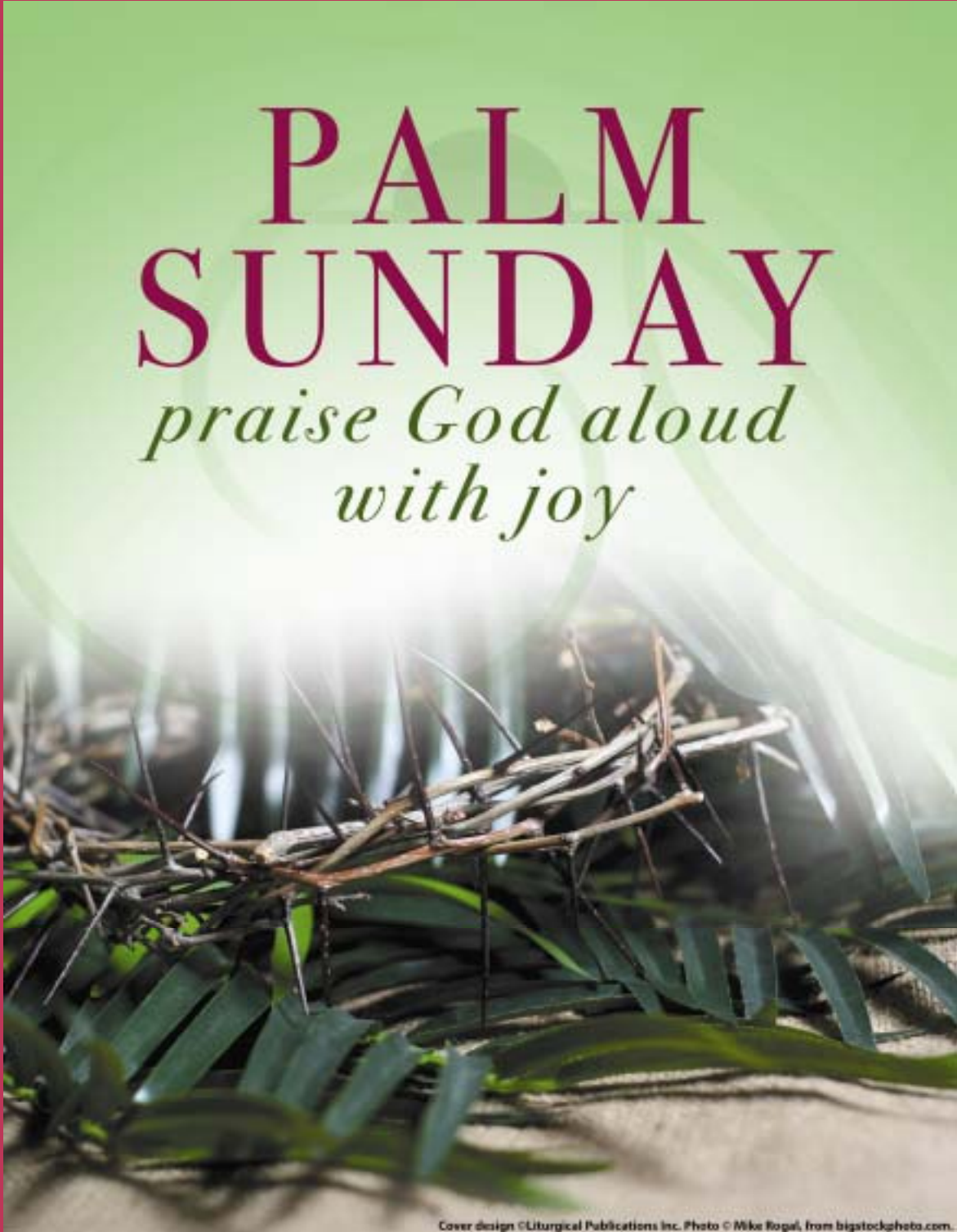

Dear Friends,

The Charity and Development Appeal is entering into the final stages and I wanted to make sure everyone has an opportunity to participate. We need everyone's help. Finances are difficult for all of us. But there are those in our community, in our parish, where finances don't even exist anymore. The sick, the homeless, the elderly, the children don't get a break because the financial world is in turmoil. They need us more than ever.

The Charity and Development Appeal funds are *dedicated funds* and can ONLY be used to support the 70 agencies of the diocese. Schools, youth programs, Maggie's Place, Seminarian training, Vocations, Missions and much more are supported through your generous gifts to the CDA. The need is greater than ever before.

Our Parish goal of \$277,000 is a difficult goal to reach. But it is not the goal that is important. It is the people who will be helped – PEOPLE. The more you can give, even in this difficult time, the more people can be assisted. Every \$5, \$10, \$20, and anything else you can give is important, so give what you can. I promise you that you will be blessed in a very special way.

If you did not receive a Pledge Card in the mail, pick one up in the church vestibule or parish office. Fill it out as soon as you can and return it to the parish. Please mark the Prayer Pledge, making a commitment to pray, not only for the success of the CDA but also for those who will be helped and need help. Then mark the amount you can give and the method of payment. We can stretch payments out over several months if that is what is needed. Example – a gift of \$50 can be stretched over 10 months at \$5 per month. Again, any amount will be greatly appreciated.

If you are unable to contribute financially, you can still participate by marking the Prayer Pledge box and make a commitment to prayer. Please return your CDA card as soon as possible.

Pastor's Corner...

First of all, I have some good news. Now that the Swine Flu threat has passed, we will resume distribution of the Precious Blood on Holy Thursday of this week, very appropriate as we celebrate the Lord's Supper. I have missed this, as you have, but the precautionary measures were good.

This weekend we begin Holy Week with the celebration of Palm Sunday. We hear for the first time the account of the Passion of Jesus. The emphasis is on Jesus, the central character in the story. What we are remembering is the fidelity, the courage, and the goodness of Jesus. Against the darkness of Calvary His goodness shines all the more brightly. The day of His death is not called "Bad Friday," but "Good Friday." It shows the love of Jesus. "Greater love no one has than to lay down one's life for one's friends." It is that love that we are remembering this week.

The Passion story shows how Jesus responded to what was done to Him. He absorbed all the violence, transformed it, and returned it as love and forgiveness. This was the victory of love over all the powers of destruction. There was nothing but love in Him. Even when they nailed His hands and feet, He was loving. It helps to think about that when we are going through hard times.

It is a consolation for us to know that Jesus suffered. Yet, His suffering would have been wasted if He had not endured it with love. It was not Jesus suffering that saved the world, but His love. Anyone who pretends to love suffering is crazy. Suffering is something that you would give almost anything to avoid. Yet, we are glad to suffer for someone we love. Our love gives meaning to our suffering. Jesus was the Good shepherd dying because He loved His sheep.

It is not suffering that redeems the world, but love. It is not our suffering that God wants, but our love. However, love inevitably brings pain. But it also brings great joy. The Christian must not only accept suffering, he or she must make it holy. Love makes it holy.



We are on the home stretch of the Charity and Development Appeal. You have been very generous, both with prayer and your financial gifts. We are ahead of last year and there is a good chance we can hit our goal. But more importantly, we can help the thousands in need of help, whether they be an infant in the womb or the senior in the sunset of their life, whether it be a child seeking a good education or the seminarian preparing for the priesthood. Over 70 agencies are helped and those 70 agencies serve thousands. If you haven't joined in this wonderful cause, there is still time. Pledge cards are available in the lobbies.

Once again, a reminder: This is the beginning of Holy Week. We have had a good Lenten journey. Now we enter into the most solemn time of the year. I hope you will make every effort to join the community for the celebration of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, Good Friday services, and especially the celebration of the Easter Vigil which begins the Easter celebrations. Dates and times are in this bulletin, so mark them on your calendar.

Liturgy Corner..

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

What a day of ups and downs! We start out with the account of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. In Luke's version, which is proclaimed this year, we hear the crowds reprise the refrain of the angels. In Luke, at Jesus' birth the angelic choir sang out, "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests" (2:14). Today, it is the citizens of Jerusalem who shout, "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest," as Jesus rides by. Completing the circle from angelic to human to every created thing, Jesus tells the Pharisees who want him to rebuke the crowd, "If they keep silent, the stones will cry out!" (19:40). This is a day of exaltation!

But it doesn't take us long to hit the lows that are also part of this day. The story of the Passion reminds us that even though Jesus was hailed as the king riding through Jerusalem, he was also crucified under that same title: Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews. Yet even as he hung upon the cross, Jesus' words spoke of forgiveness. He prayed, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." He said to the repentant thief, "You will be with me in Paradise."

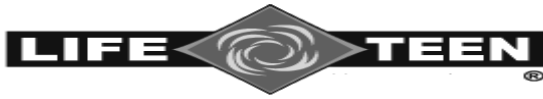
In some ways the experience of this day reflects what happens to us in everyday life. For the most part, our life is a series of ups and downs. There are days when things go well, and days when life seems to treat us badly. What is called for is a response consistent with a Christian way of living. In his darkest moments, Jesus did not give up hope. He promised the thief paradise. Jesus also did not give in to vengeance, but instead forgave. How we live through the ups and downs of life will reveal how we put into practice each day the example given to us by the Savior.
