Pastor's Corner...

"This is how all will know that you are my disciples – if you love one another." Jn 13:35

Today we understand more than ever the complexity of human nature and the mixed motives behind everything we do. There are at least 5 kinds of love.

The first is utilitarian love. We love another because he or she is useful to us. But that is more like selfishness than love. I want something from you, but I don't want you.

The second kind is romantic love. This is the kind of affection we have for one another because of the pleasure the other gives us. We are infatuated with the other person. But that's not love. We may think it is the other person we love, but we are in fact loving ourselves. Usually this doesn't last, which is one reason why some marriages fail.

The third kind of love is democratic love, which is based on equality under the law. We respect others because they are fellow citizens. We recognize their liberties in order that ours, in turn, may be recognized. The reason for contributing to the good of others is the expectation of a return good.

The fourth kind is humanitarian love. This is love of humanity in general. The weakness of this type of love is that it is love in the abstract, rather than in the concrete: "I love humanity, but can't stand people."

The fifth kind is Christian love, summed up in the commandment of Jesus: "Love one another as I have loved you." Here we are talking about disinterested love, loving even when there is nothing in it for us. This love persists despite hostility and persecution. It expresses itself in service, affection and self-sacrifice. This kind of love can be achieved only with the help of the Holy Spirit.

People tend to see the problem of love as being loved rather than being a loving person. They end of without love because they are loved, not for themselves, but for something they possess or that they have achieved. In the end all of us want to be loved for ourselves.

Love brings out the best in the one who loves. People are at their best when they love. They are like a glowing lamp. Love is a choice, not a feeling. But to refuse to love is to begin to die. The worse thing of all is a cold indifference.

"If you could have a conversation with someone, living or dead, who would it be?"

"I'd choose the one who's living."

"Hello? Is this the fire department?"

"Yes."

"Listen, my house is on fire! You've got to come right away! It's terrible!"

"Okay, how do we get to your house?"

"You don't have those big red trucks anymore?"

Have a great week. Keep smiling! People will wonder what you are thinking about.

Liturgy Corner..

5th Sunday of Easter

One of the great lines of the Bible, and one of its most important theological concepts, appears in today's second reading from the Book of Revelation. The author testifies that he hears the One who sits on the throne say: "Behold, I make all things new" (Rev 21:5). Recall that when Revelation was being written, the church was undergoing persecution. Those Christians familiar with Jewish writings (what we Christians call the Old Testament today) looked to the past to seek out the ways that God had acted before. They found resonance in the oracles of deutero-Isaiah, who promised a Messiah after the leaders of Israel had been taken to captivity in Babylon. In chapter 43 of Isaiah, God proclaims that He will restore Israel, He will do something new by rebuilding the city of Jerusalem.

Jerusalem becomes symbolic of the eternal dwelling of God's chosen people. It is the place of peace and contentment. It is God's dwelling to which every nation on earth comes to dwell. And so it is no surprise when the writer of Revelation proclaims to the persecuted Christian community (who saw themselves as God's new chosen people, enduring trials just like the Hebrews of long ago) that a new Jerusalem is coming down out of heaven as a dwelling place for God and his people.

This promise of hope in a time of persecution is meant to encourage those who may be tempted to falter. In our own day, so many of us have been battered by difficult times. Each of us may have our own tale of woe. The Gospel for today reminds us that Jesus gave us a new commandment: to love one another. No matter how difficult things may be, that commandment endures. It also gives us hope, for we are united in love.

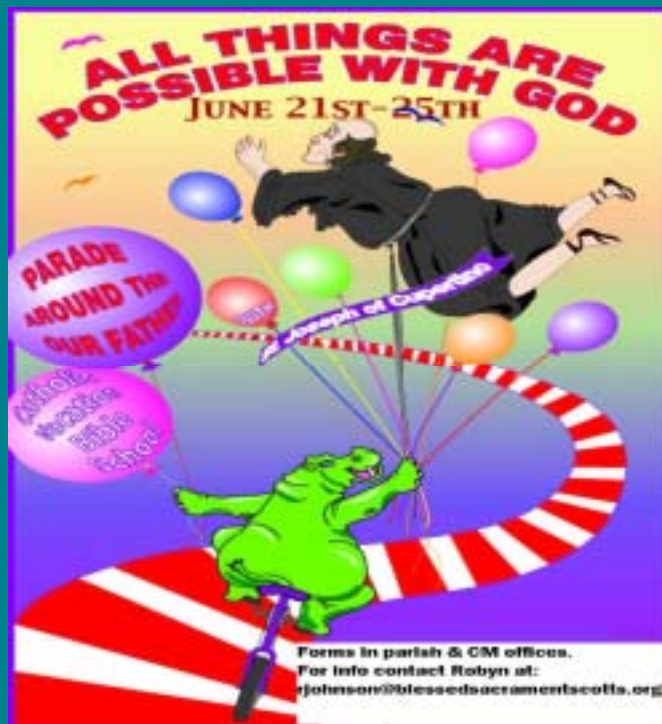
**Thank You to Woman's Club
