Pastor's Corner...

During the Last Supper Jesus spoke about leaving. Not surprisingly, the apostles were plunged into gloom at the prospect of losing Him. They didn't want Him to go. They wanted to hold on to Him. It's not easy to let go of someone you love.

But in this way they were thinking, not of Him, but of themselves. He told them so. He said, "If you loved me you would have been glad to know that I am going to the Father, for the Father is greater than I." For Jesus to go back to the Father was the goal of His life. To try to hold Him back from this was not to show love for Him.

Possessive love is very common. Some parents are very possessive in their love for their children. Having given life to them, they refuse to let them live that life in their own way. The same thing happens in some marriages. There is a reluctance to let one's partner have a life of his or her own.

Possessive love causes a lot of pain and does a lot of harm. Non-possessive love, on the other hand, does wonders for both parties.

Growth, progress, change call for a letting go, a losing of something which we have at present and which we value dearly. But the losing is with a view to gaining something new and better.

In leaving the apostles, Jesus made it clear that He was not abandoning them. He said to them, "It is for your own good that I am going because unless I go, the Spirit will not come; but if I go, I will send him to you." And He was as good as His word! When we willingly let go of people, they can leave us without us feeling that they are abandoning us.

And we open ourselves to receive something new from them, something they could not give us unless they left.

Jesus comes to bring us life and to liberate us from ourselves. He calms our fears and heals our anguish and hatreds, thus enabling us to look at the world with a still heart and an open soul.

A religious education class was almost finished making their models of the nativity scene and one little boy had done a lovely job. Some animals, Mary, Joseph, three wise men, shepherds were all there. However the teacher noticed an extra overweight man in the scene as well.

"Who is that person?" she asked.

"Oh, that's Round John Virgin."

Liturgy Corner..

As the author of Revelation makes clear in today's selection, there is no temple or sun or moon in this new Jerusalem. The Lord is the temple and the glory of God is the city's light. This is God's dwelling among his people.

The Gospel of John for today makes the presence of the Lord even clearer. Jesus tells His disciples, "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him" (Jn 14:23). Through baptism God dwells in us—an amazing truth that may escape us in the midst of daily life.

We want to be with God. We try to live our lives in such a way that we will come at last to the heavenly city, the new and eternal Jerusalem. And that end-of-life focus is good. We need to be prepared for our final day. But God already dwells among us, as Jesus told His disciples as they were gathered in the upper room for the Last Supper. The Lord is here in our midst, now. We are no longer only hoping for a final dwelling with God in heaven. If God is already dwelling in our midst, then every baptized person that stands before us is Christ. If that is the case, then we are no longer just being nice to someone because that is the polite thing to do. Instead, we are giving honor and glory to God by the respect we show.

How Old Does a Child Need to Be in Order to Stay Alone?

Don't assume that when your child understands what you're saying, he's ready to walk out the door by himself. Besides the fact that many states have laws against leaving children of certain ages alone (for example, younger than 12), experts say children shouldn't be left by themselves until they're capable of fighting off an abductor or handling a crisis situation. Experts also say children do not have the mental maturity to cross busy streets by themselves until they're about 10 or 12 years old. (Did you know that pedestrian injuries rank third in child fatalities, behind traffic accidents and drowning?) Finally, parents who are certain their young children would never walk away with a stranger will be shocked to learn that studies show they probably will. Stay alert and vigilant, even if you believe your child is aware of possible dangers from others. Terry Goddard Alerts Consumers to the Risk of Health Care Scams



Arizona Attorney General Terry Goddard is warning Arizona residents to be cautious of door-to-door and telephone scam artists peddling phony insurance policies in an effort to capitalize on the new federal health care law and defraud consumers.

Some scam artists have attempted to make dishonest profits by urging consumers to obtain coverage in a non-existent "limited enrollment" period that they falsely claim was made possible by the new legislation. Arizona law requires companies and their agents to be licensed to market or sell insurance.

"These attempts by scam artists to dupe people into buying phony health insurance will be prosecuted," Goddard stated. "I urge every Arizonan who is approached by someone who represents that their insurance policies are required by the new health care law to report such persons to our office."

The Attorney General offers the following tips regarding door-to-door sales:

- Get the address and phone number of the company and the credentials of the sales representative before making a purchase.
- Do not be rushed into a decision, no matter how attractive the deal sounds.
- Be cautious of sales people who suggest they are affiliated with the government.
- Do not let a stranger into your home. Talk outside or through a security screen door.

If you believe you have been a victim of fraud, please contact the Attorney General's Office in Phoenix at 602.542.5763; in Tucson at 520.628.6504; or outside the Phoenix and Tucson metro areas at 1.800.352.8431. To file a complaint in person, the Attorney General's Office has satellite offices throughout the state with volunteers available to help. Locations and hours of operation are posted on the Attorney General's Web site at www.azag.gov. Consumers can also file complaints online by visiting the Attorney General's Web site.
