Pastor's Corner...

Before leaving His apostles, Jesus commissioned them to preach the Gospel to the whole world. In order to help them carry out that mission He promised to send them the Holy Spirit. On Pentecost day He fulfilled that promise.

The task of preaching the Gospel to the world now depends on us. We are Christ's witnesses. It's a great privilege, but an enormous task. However, we also can rely on the help of the Holy Spirit. But how are we to witness?

There is the witness of words. We witness by professing our faith. This could include explaining it and defending it.

There is the witness of deeds. An apple tree that never produced an apple would be a poor witness for the orchard. Even one good apple speaks. "Never recommend anything unless you can provide a sample of it." (Thoreau)

Then there is the witness of one's life. Trees witness to life just by being. Tall, straight, motionless, they are silent yet eloquent witnesses to life. Flowers bear witness to beauty simply by being what they are. And Christians bear witness by what they are. The most eloquent sermon is the silent sermons of example. Today people no longer want to listen to sermons on faith. They want to see the Gospel in action.

The witness of Christian life is more powerful than any argument. There are those whose lives bear radiant witness to the transforming power of the faith. In their lives the faith is a bright flame, whereas in the lives of others it is a dim glow or an occasional spark. The person, who, despite all his /her human limitations and defects, lives a simple life, taking Christ as the model, is a sign of God and of transcendent realities.

There is a hunger in the world today for the Christ in the Gospels. Jesus said to an apostle, "Stay in the city, until you are clothed with power from on high." The power in

question was the power of the Holy Spirit. We need that same power if we are to witness to Jesus. Those who witness will share His glory.

Liturgy Corner..

Ascension of the Lord

He is risen! He has ascended! He is with us! Alleluia!

It may seem odd at first to put those exclamations together, but the truth is that they are all united in a line of thought. There would be no Christians if Jesus had not risen from the dead. The resurrection of Christ is the foundation of our faith. His rising from the tomb gives us the promise of new life since through his resurrection he has conquered sin and broken the chains of death. His ascension to the right hand of the Father is a sign of hope for us all. As the preface to the Eucharistic prayer for this day says: Christ "has passed beyond our sight, not to abandon us but to be our hope? Where he has gone, we hope to follow". But he is still with us, through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, the gift poured out on all the baptized. As the alternate preface for today states, "In his risen body [Christ] plainly showed himself to His disciples and was taken up to heaven in their sight to claim for us a share in His divine life". Christ is with us through the divine life that we share. So it is pretty easy to shout, "Alleluia!"

Of course, like the disciples on that Ascension day, we might wish that Jesus was still physically walking around on this earth right next to us. If we succumb to that longing, we forget the commission that Jesus gave to His disciples-including us. In His name we are to preach repentance for the forgiveness of sins to all the nations. We are to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth. While we may not take up the path of missionary endeavor in some foreign land as some Christians do, we are still called to witness to Christ with that same missionary zeal through our lives each day.

Because of the seemingly caring and seductive talent of child molesters, teenagers should be warned that when they are in a chat room, they should never provide anyone with private information, personal information, and especially their specific physical location.
