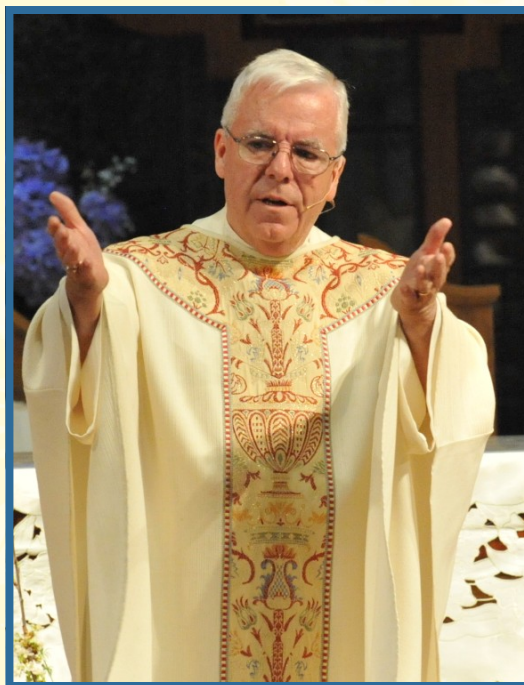

Tornadoes in the Midwest



Recent tornadoes have devastated communities in several states with much damage and loss of life. Bishop Olmsted has approved participation by our diocese in the relief effort to help these communities. Please give what you can until the end of June.

Pastor's Corner...

In this weekend's gospel we have part of the farewell discourse Of Jesus during the Last Supper. In these last hours with His apostles He spoke about essentials. Many of the things He said we naturally directed towards the future, at how He wanted them to live when He was gone. One of the things He said to them was, "If you love me, keep my commandments."

We are not talking about keeping a specific set of commandments, but rather about following His way of life. What is involved here is discipleship. We can't really call ourselves disciples of Jesus if we don't listen to His words and make an effort to live by them. One wouldn't be much of a Christians if one didn't try to love as Jesus taught.

But one thing is clear. We don't keep His commandments because He loves us. During the same supper Jesus said, "Love one another as I have loved you." It was He who first loved the apostles, and loved them unconditionally.

The greatest need each of us has is for real, unconditional love. Yet we find it hard to believe this is how God loves us. We tend to believe that God will love us only if we are good. God loves us, not because we are good, but because He is good. Our very existence is a sign of God's love. God's unconditional love for us is the Good News. Our response is to try to return that love.

Jesus knew the Father loved Him. He responded by loving the Father. He showed His love for the Father through His obedience, even though that obedience cost Him His life. And it is through obedience that we are to show our love for Jesus. It means listening to His word and putting it into action. To love is to obey. And to obey is to love.

It is not easy to live as a disciple of Jesus in the modern world. It never was an easy thing. But for that reason He has given us the Holy Spirit. The Spirit comforts us in times of sorrow, enlightens us in times of darkness, and makes us brave and strong in times of weakness.

The apostles knew Jesus loved them. And we know that Jesus loves us also. There is no mistaking love. You feel it in your heart. It is like a flame that warms your soul, energizes your spirit and supplies passion to your life. Love is our connection to God and each other.

"Love one another as I have loved you."
That sums it up!

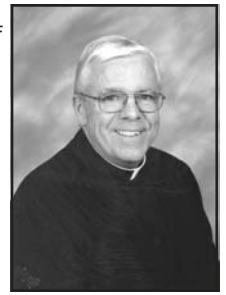
Men are like a fine wine. They all start out like grapes and you have to stomp on them and keep them in the dark until they mature into something you'd like to have dinner with.

Reflection Corner...

Every once in a while a dispute about the display of the Ten Commandments on public property makes the news. These public displays usually involve the text of the commandments from the Book of Exodus, also known as the Protestant version. The Catholic version, which comes from the list in the book of Deuteronomy, rarely gets acknowledged in such disputes.

Neither the commandments in Exodus, nor the ones in Deuteronomy, are the commandments that Jesus is concerned about in today's Gospel. While those minimal expectations are to be followed, Jesus has a much greater precept that he wants His followers to observe. The command that Jesus gives is the law of reciprocal love. He expects His followers to love Him and in return He and the Father will love them. And Jesus commands His followers to love one another in the same way that He loves them.

This command of love raises the bar on the level of expectations. For the Christian, it is no longer a minimal level of moral behavior that fulfills the covenant. Instead, it is a complete renewal of life that is required, a renewal which begins with an encounter with the Father through Jesus and comes full circle in the love for one another. The minimum requirements of the law are not enough. Instead, love becomes the singular command that must be fulfilled: love of God, and love of one another. Disputes about the Ten Commandments have gone on for years, and will likely continue for years to come. Likewise, there are always debates about the concrete ways of fulfilling Christ's command to love. But His words to His followers are very clear: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (Jn 14:15).
