Pastor's Corner...

Jesus, the Healer

I had a dream that I came to the Lord
trembling, ashamed, fearful and sad.
And I told Him my tale of betrayals.
When I had finished, I continued to kneel there,
waiting for the punishment I felt I richly deserved.
But what did He do?
He rose from His chair, took some ointment, and said,
"Let me dress your wounds."
"What wounds?" I asked, puzzled
"I'm the one who has wounded others."
But then in a flash I saw He was right.
I too was wounded, for to sin is to suffer.
Astonished by His mercy, I let Him dress my wounds.
Afterwards I went away airborne with joy.
His sheer goodness made me feel that I too was good,
and made me want to be like Him.

In the Gospel today, Simon the Pharisee is resentful of the "sinful" woman who is anointing and kissing the feet of Jesus. Jesus teaches Simon a lesson in forgiveness: The greater the sin forgiven, the greater the love expressed."

Jesus invites us to cancel debts and forgive those who have trespassed against us. Yet our wounds may be deep. Forgiveness may seem unthinkable. We have gone to war to avenge 9/11, and persons hurt can easily define our very existence. But if we do not forgive, then how can we say the Lord's Prayer and truly mean it?

Forgiving others, especially after a deep hurt, may take a lifetime to accomplish. What is important is that we take the first step and let Jesus lead the way.

A Parish Manager requested bids from local painters to re-paint the outside of the Pastoral Center. Almost all of the bids were within a few dollars of one another, with the exception of one by a parishioner who had been in business for years and had an excellent reputation in the community. This particular painter's bid was about half of his competitors, and naturally, the parish manager accepted it.



On the day he was to begin, the painter realized that he had miscalculated badly. Not wanting to lose the job, he decided to thin the paint with water. That way, he thought, he would be able to complete the job for the price quoted.

A week later, he received a call from the Parish Manager, complaining that after the first rain half of the paint washed off the building. Being an honorable man and a good Catholic, the painter went inside to pray about the situation, knowing that his business' reputation was on the line.

"What can I possibly do, Lord?" prayed the discouraged painter.

In a loud voice God replied, "Repaint! Repaint and thin no more!"

(I guess I should have warned you of the punch line!)

Liturgy Corner..

We'd like our children to be perfect angels. As parents, we spend a lot of time teaching them proper manners, coaching them on moral behavior, and helping them understand right from wrong. And while we would like everything they do to be good and right, we know that sometimes our sons and daughters have to learn from their mistakes. We just hope and pray that the mistakes in their lives are minor and give them an education, as opposed to serious problems that lead to calamitous results. Sometimes, as parents, we have to take a stand (tough love, some call it) as a way of holding firm to certain principles of behavior.

The woman in the Gospel today is described as a sinner, although Luke never specifies the actual sin. We like to imagine the worst -adultery, harlotry. Maybe we do that because if she's guilty of really awful sins (after all, Jesus said that her many sins were forgiven), then she's not quite like us. We can stand on the side of righteousness-just like the Pharisee! (Whoops! Is that really the side we want to be on?)

Well, yes, it is. We do want to be on the side of righteousness. But we don't want to be on the side of self-righteousness. That is the delicate balance that each of us must strike. When our own children behave badly, we have to be prepared with correction. But we also have to be ready with forgiveness. Mercy is also one of the certain principles of Christian life. And just as God's justice is tempered with eternal mercy, so must our own desire for the right be guided by a merciful love. It's not always an easy balance to strike, but as we'll hear throughout this year as we read from Luke's Gospel, God's mercy is without limit or end.

The hand of the Lord feeds us; He answers all of our needs.

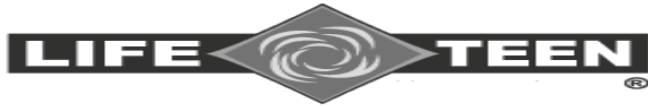

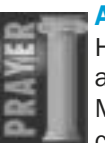
