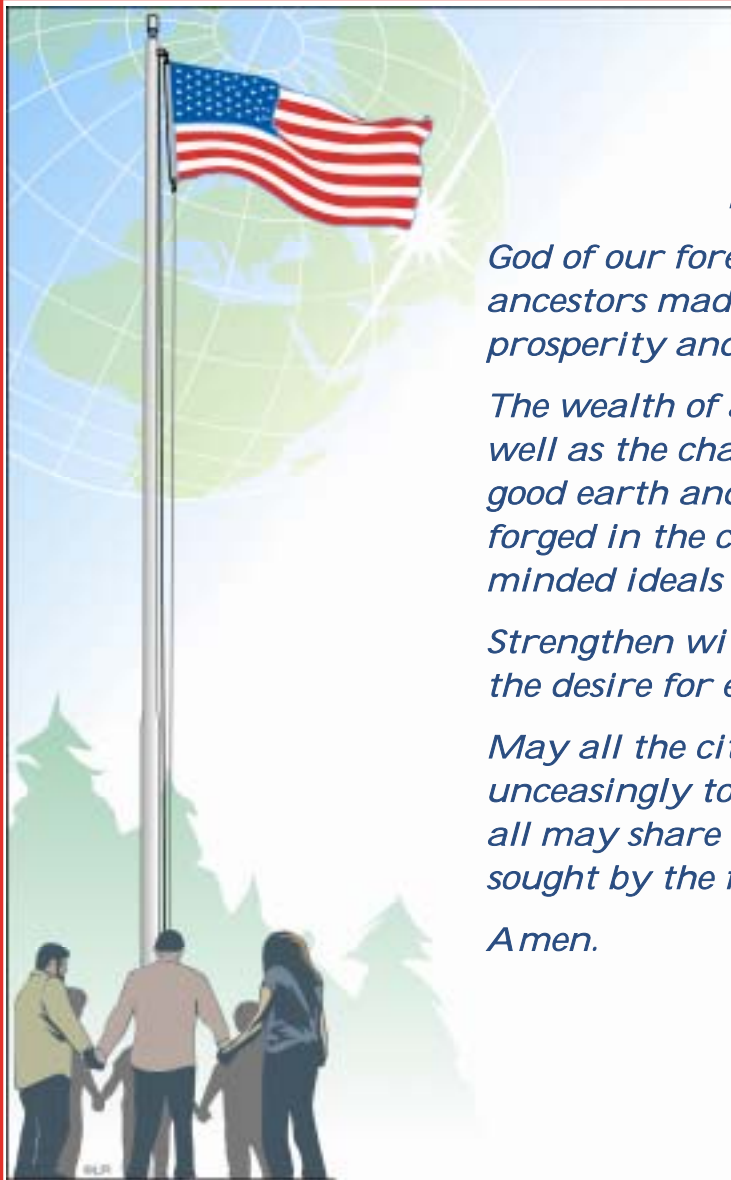

We Americans take our freedom very seriously. We fight for it for ourselves and for others. That is what we celebrate this weekend; the freedom symbolized by the signing of the Declaration of Independence. What does Freedom mean for us; not just as Americans but also as Roman Catholics? Does it mean we are free to do what ever we please? Consider Freedom lived in the 4-Pillars of Stewardship:

- **Hospitality** - We are free to choose love - to welcome all regardless of race, nationality, or religion. We are free to love those whom Jesus loved - the sinners, the sick, the poor, the outcasts.
- **Prayer** - We are free to choose how, when, and where we pray. We are free to pray with anyone we wish regardless of race, nationality, or religion. We are free to pray with those with whom Jesus prayed - the laborers, the lame, the wounded, the seekers.
- **Formation** - We are free to learn about and share our faith. We are free to share with anyone we wish regardless of race, nationality, or religion. We are free to share with those with whom Jesus shared - the newly weds, the prophets, the blasphemers, the children.
- **Service** - We are free to serve others. We are free to serve anyone we wish regardless of race, nationality, or religion. We are free to serve those whom Jesus served - the lepers, the hungry, the parents, the thieves.

Our freedom is more of a gift and a responsibility than it is a right.

## Pastor's Corner...

In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus sends His 72 disciples to preach the Gospel and then they come back rejoicing at the success of their mission. Upon their return, Jesus says something interesting, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky." Those who trust in God and obey His call in their lives, as did the 72, will experience God's power acting in and through their lives, which is exactly what Christ wants. That experience will open the door to the stable kind of happiness that only God can give, because it teaches us to depend on God, who is all-powerful, and not on ourselves, who are far off from being all powerful

Our happiness as Christians doesn't depend of how great we are or how great our achievements have been. It comes from knowing that we matter to God, that God is our Father, Savior and Friend.

We have a tendency to base our happiness, our satisfaction on successes and pleasures that we can see and touch. But these are only pointers, invitations, but the real celebration, the real meaning of life is God. Only by maintaining an awareness of God's interest in and love for us, will we be able to experience the deeper and more stable happiness that can bring meaning and satisfaction even in the middle of hardship and suffering.

The easiest and most effective way to do that is by cultivating and "attitude of gratitude." When we stop to think about the good things we have received from God, it puts the tough things in perspective. It reminds us that God hasn't forgotten about us, and never will forget about us. It reminds us that we are loved by the Creator of the universe - what an awesome thought! When that knowledge is fresh in our minds, we become fountains of joy, wisdom, and strength.

Take a few minutes every day - maybe on the way to work, maybe before dinner, maybe before we go to sleep, to do what the wise old proverb encourages us to do: Count your blessings!

Speaking about counting blessings, let us give thanks for living in the greatest nation in the world. Sure, it is not perfect. Sure, we have our problems and disagreements. But we do have the freedom to disagree. We live in the "Land of the free - Home of the brave!" How lucky we are. How blest we are. And with all that comes a big responsibility. The Statue of Liberty says it all. "Give me your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free, the wretched refuse of your teeming shore. Send these, the homeless, the tempest-tossed to me, I lift my lamp beside the golden door."

## Liturgy Corner..

In itself, no single event is seen as the definitive cause for the Revolutionary War. But the cumulative effect of the grievances-most outlined in the Declaration of Independence-saw many in the colonies rise up against the British, whose army, once thought of as protectors, was now thought of as an occupying force. Those whom we call patriots today, were thought by some of their fellow citizens to be rabble-rousers and criminals. History has a way of sorting things out.

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends His disciples out to announce the kingdom of God. This was not a move for political power (though some saw it that way) or even for earthly success. It was not even so much a rebellion against the past as a fulfillment of promises made by God long ago. "The kingdom of God is at hand for you," the disciples proclaimed.

The message of Jesus has lasted far longer than nations or kingdoms. Christ is not allied with any government or political faction. God's kingdom exists apart from any political boundaries or human limitations. As Christians, we recognize our responsibility to seek justice and peace. Our calling is to promote the common good, even at the expense of our own self-interest. While we celebrate independence, we also understand that liberty does not mean unfettered license to do what we please. The kingdom of God is not so much a place of individual right as one of communal responsibility. And as citizens of that kingdom we submit ourselves to the law of love for God and for our neighbor.

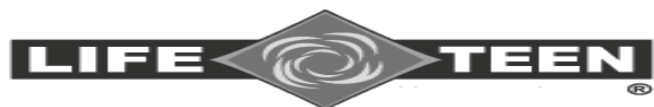

## What is the Difference Between Tithing and Stewardship?

Both tithing and stewardship are part of a spiritual way of life that calls us to use all of our resources for the service of the Gospel. Everything we are and everything we have comes from God. Offering back to God something of what he has given us is part of how we worship and give thanks to God.

Tithing is the practice of giving back ten percent of what we earn. It comes from the Old English word for ten. The first scriptural example of tithing came from Abraham giving a tenth of his possessions to the priest Melchizedek. He did so as an act of thanksgiving to God. Stewardship calls us to use well all that we have and all that we are, placing all things in service of others. Stewardship helps us see the good we can accomplish by making God and our spiritual life the most important values in our life. Whatever wealth we accumulate in this life stays here. We can't take it with us! Both tithing and stewardship help us remember that nothing is mine or even ours; all belongs to God.

### Who Are the Abusers?

Estimates are that approximately 60% of abusers are men, 15 to 20% are women, and 20 to 40% are men and women acting together. So while men are indeed the majority of sexual abusers, it is dangerous to underestimate the risk that female sexual abusers also pose to children. Among educators, 57.2% of abusers are male, and 42.4% of abusers are female.

## Arizona's Heat Can be Deadly...

Arizona's heat is not just uncomfortable, it is dangerous and deadly for many people in our community, especially the people who work outdoors, young children, the elderly, and the homeless. This is an important time to check on your neighbors, especially if they are elderly or live alone. Heat related illness falls into three major categories:

### Some tips to avoid heat-related illness include:

- Never leave infants, children, or pets in a parked vehicle.
- Increase fluid intake, regardless of activity level.
- Avoid beverages containing alcohol, caffeine, or large amounts of sugar as they dehydrate the body.
- Avoid very cold beverages as they may cause stomach cramps.
- Limit outdoor activity between 11AM and 3PM when the sun is at peak intensity.
- Wear sunscreen with a minimum SPF of 15.
- Carry bottled water in the car for yourself, your passengers, and anyone you see who might be suffering from the heat.

If you see someone you believe is in heat distress, call 911 for assistance...You could save a life!
