

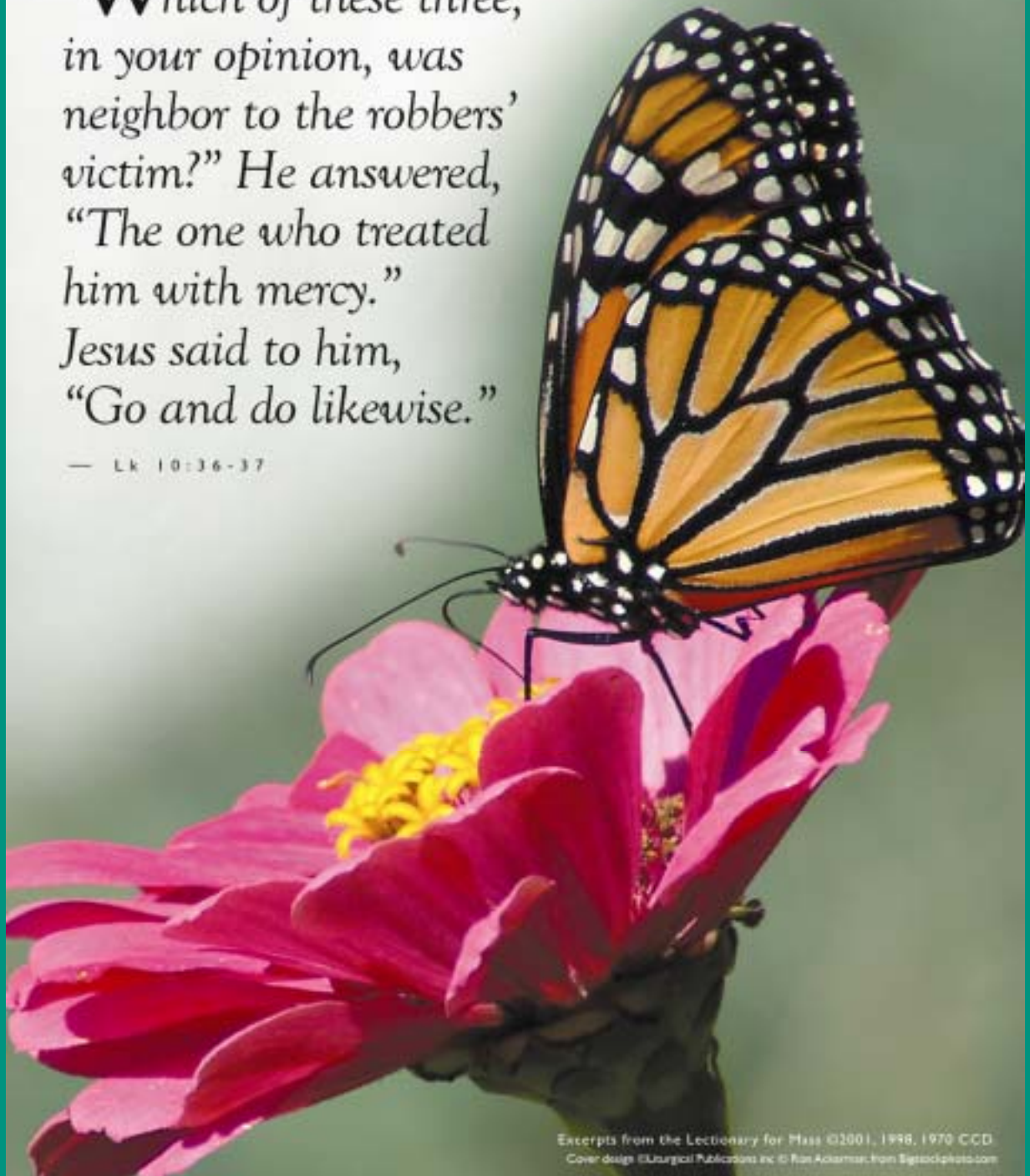

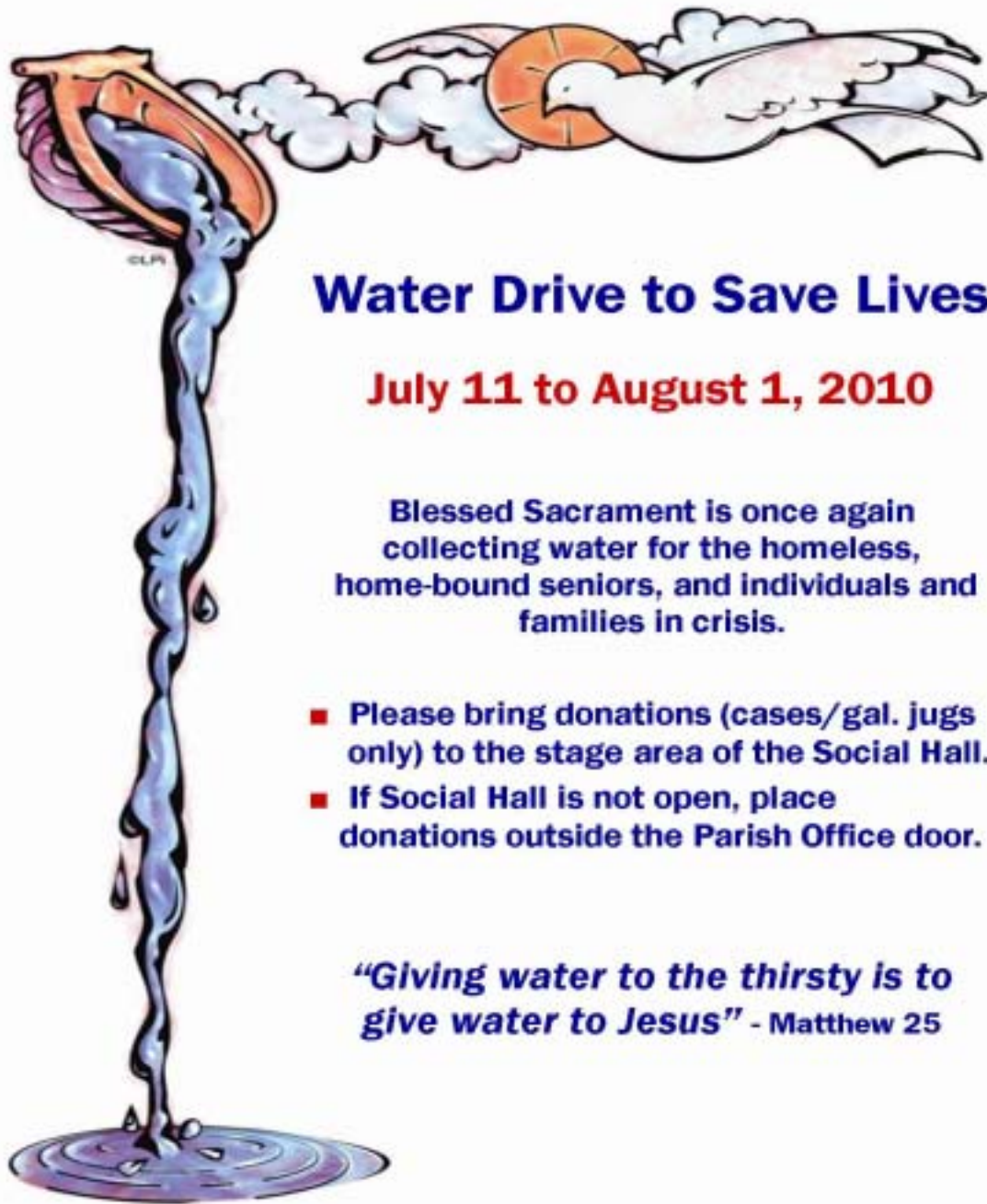

## Pastor's Corner...

Once an American was touring Alaska in a motor home when his worst fear came true; he broke an axle in the motor home, and he found himself stranded in what looked like the middle of nowhere. Leaving his family in the motor home, he decided to walk on in hope of finding someone who might be able to help them. (This was before mobile phones.)

After going a few miles he had a great stroke of luck: he came upon a farm house. He told the farmer about his predicament. The farmer was very sympathetic. Fortunately the farmer had welding equipment. He towed the motor home to his farmyard with his tractor and there repaired the broken axle. When the job was finished the tourist reached for his wallet and said, "How much do I owe you?"

"You don't owe me anything," the farmer replied

"But I feel I must repay you for what you have done for me."

"You have already done so," said the farmer.

"I don't understand," said the tourist.

"You have given me the pleasure of your company for a couple hours."

The man was stunned but delighted at having encountered such generosity. People like that restore our belief in the basic goodness of human beings. Goodness is as much a mystery as evil. But where evil saddens and depresses us, goodness delights and inspires us.

The highest state we can attain is when goodness becomes an easy flow of grace, uncalculating and natural, when it falls from us without our noticing. In the case of the farmer we are dealing with spontaneous goodness. Such is the case of the Samaritan in this gospel. It is obvious that for the Samaritan goodness had become habitual, spontaneous, second nature. The nice thing about people like that is that they don't think they have done anything special. For some, generosity consists in a few sporadic acts; for others, it is a way of life.

The most disturbing thing in Jesus' story is not the attack made on an innocent man, but the fact that two people who you would expect to help him passed by without even showing compassion for him. A true Christian is not indifferent to the suffering of another.

"Who is my neighbor?" asked the lawyer. The common answer at the time would be: My neighbor comes from my own tribe, or circle, or religion. But the answer Jesus gave was: My neighbor is whoever I choose to be a neighbor to. The real question is not who do I consider to be my neighbor, but who am I willing to treat as a neighbor?

What kind of neighbor am I?  
It's a question we ought to ask ourselves every now and then.

## Liturgy Corner..

One of the classic images in a catalogue of stained glass art is that of the good Samaritan. Along with the prodigal son, and Jesus blessing the children, the good Samaritan is one of the most commonly reproduced artistic scenes. Within 125 years of the first printed English Bibles the term "good Samaritan" came to have the figurative sense referring to anyone who helped a stranger in distress. Interestingly, the biblical text never uses the word "good" to describe the Samaritan. He is referred to as "neighbor" to the man who fell victim to robbers. Yet if someone refers to a person as a good Samaritan, we know instantly what is meant.

As we've all heard before, Samaritans were considered outcasts by Jews at the time of Jesus. Because they worshipped on Mt. Gerizim rather than in Jerusalem there were tensions between Jews and Samaritans that even escalated to violence that had to be quelled by the Roman occupiers. So it was a very pretty picture when the lawyer who questioned Jesus finds himself having to admit that it was the Samaritan who treated the robbers' victim with mercy.

What is our own understanding of who is our neighbor in the present day? The parable is such an enduring tale that its meaning has slipped into our common language. But that has happened at the expense of the story's punch line, and it is one that packs a real punch! Who are the outcasts or the despised in our day? What class of people have we found it difficult to accept? Or who might we find it easy to denigrate? The homeless? Immigrants? Muslims? Someone else? What if they were the Samaritan? Would we love the story as much if Jesus asked us today, "Which of these, in your opinion, was neighbor?" How would we answer?.

## Stewardship...Go and Do Likewise

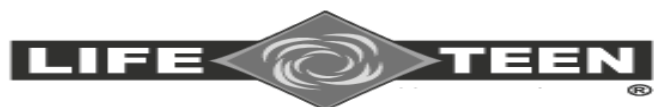
We do not always get the opportunity to plan elements of our 4-Pillar life style. Prayer is somewhat predictable with Mass, or the Liturgy of the Hours, etc. Formation usually occurs during scheduled times.

While Hospitality and Service can also be planned out, they are subject to more calls for spontaneous action than the others (IMHO).

For me, this is the valuable lesson in today's Gospel. The Good Samaritan hospitably served the beaten traveler right away. He didn't say - "Sorry, can't stop right now." The Good Samaritan also did not limit his help. He didn't say "Here's a rag for your wounds; I'll drop you off at the nearest Inn. Good luck after that."

Our challenge in this society is to be willing to stop what we are doing and respond as the Good Samaritan responded. That beaten traveler needed the Samaritan to BE Jesus to him right then and there - in the same manner Jesus needs us to Be Him to each other and to the strangers we meet while we try to live 4-Pillar Stewardship.
