Specifically, I hope that the fruit of this Congress results in the establishment of Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration in all parishes and Christian communities throughout the world. The best, the surest and the most effective way of establishing peace on the face of the earth is through the great power of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament."*

God's Generosity

The Holy Eucharist is the sacrament of God's infinite generosity towards man. When we are generous in our response to Him in this sacrament of love, God pours out His infinite goodness upon all mankind. God will bless you, your family and the world ten times as much for this sacrifice because God cannot be outdone in generosity. Whatever we give to Him, He gives us back ten, a hundred times as much.

Those who are generous and willing to make a sacrifice by taking one of the most difficult hours are the ones who bring down God's blessings upon the earth like rain that pours forth from the heavens. This is why Pope John Paul II exclaimed: *"Let us be generous in our time in going to meet him..." (Dominicae Cenaes).*

Benefits of Spending Time with Jesus

When the late Mother Teresa established a daily hour of adoration for herself and her Sisters, vocations to her congregation doubled! A Bishop reported recently, that out of 20 vocations to the priesthood, 19 came from parishes where Perpetual

Adoration was established! The personal spiritual benefits of spending even one hour totally with Jesus - loving Him, praising Him, thanking Him, or just being 'there' with Him - are beyond words.

As Jesus said to the Apostles in Gethsemane: "Could you not watch one hour with Me?" We surely owe Him an hour of our time - after all He's done for us! Come to Adoration in our Chapel. Stop in for prayer—Jesus is waiting for you. All are invited to come spend time in prayer in the presence of our Lord.

Your time with Jesus is a special time. While visiting our Lord, you might wish to... Pray... Read from Sacred Scripture... Meditate on spiritual writings.. Use a prayer book provided in Chapel... Simply just sit in the presence of our Lord in humble Adoration.

Pastor's Corner...

We do not take our spiritual life seriously if we do not set aside some time to be with, and to listen to God. Most of us say some morning and evening prayers. But these prayers often consist of familiar words, which we mumble in haste while our thoughts are occupied with the busyness of the day. For many people prayer consists of saying prayers rather than praying. In a sense, prayer begins where expression ends. The highest form of worship is silence. The most beneficial prayer of all is just to be in the presence of God, without saying or doing anything. Prayer can be just sitting in his presence, as Mary sat in the presence of Jesus in the gospel. But to some, this might seem a waste of time when there are so many things to do.

To be in the presence of God, without saying or doing anything is no easy thing. Because as soon as we stop, we feel empty, even useless. Most people get their sense of self-worth from doing. They don't know how to cope with idleness and stillness. The result is our lives can be shallow and superficial.

We need to spend time in prayer and reflection, if only to sit quietly in the presence of God. This is not a waste of time but time well spent. Each day we should try, if only for a short while, to seek the face of God. Ultimately, prayer is not about words but about communion with God. Prayer is resting in the presence of God. It's more a question of staying quiet in his presence than of saying prayers.

Liturgy Corner..

We've all been to banquets where the waiters and waitresses scurry around to get the food served as quickly as possible. . A food service manager can explain the choreography involved in training a staff and the preparation that takes place for each meal based on the number and courses of meals being served. Even the occasional request for hot tea instead of coffee-that ubiquitous drink-is planned for and diagrammed. Every hospitality manager wants the service to go well.

In today's Gospel, Martha is a bit like that nervous hospitality manager. Jesus was a well-known prophet with a significant following. He was welcomed by Martha at her home. Luke never says why. Did she have the biggest house? Was she hoping for some momentary fame in the village? Was she a relative to one of the many disciples? Did she know Jesus from an earlier encounter? Or did she bake the best lemon meringue pie? (Well, we know it wasn't that one.) In any event, Jesus was there, and Martha certainly wanted to make a good impression just like any host or hostess.

At first blush, we might think Jesus' rebuke to Martha as a bit of a put down. Almost like telling folks at a conference banquet, "Listen to the speaker; ignore the waiters." But that is exactly what a good hospitality manager aims for, service personnel that are so competent that they are unobtrusive. And maybe that is the lesson we can take from the Gospel. We are to perform our service to God and neighbor in and unobtrusive, even unheralded, manner. We go about our lives not bragging about what good we've done. We just do it.

Prayer – Do we thank God for ALL that He has given us to do HIS will or do we just continue to ask for what WE want?

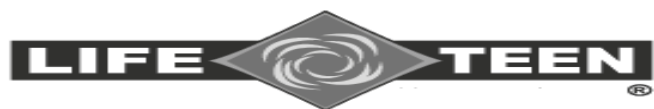
Formation – Are we life long learners constantly growing and sharing our wisdom or are we locked in the box of what we think we know, never venturing further?

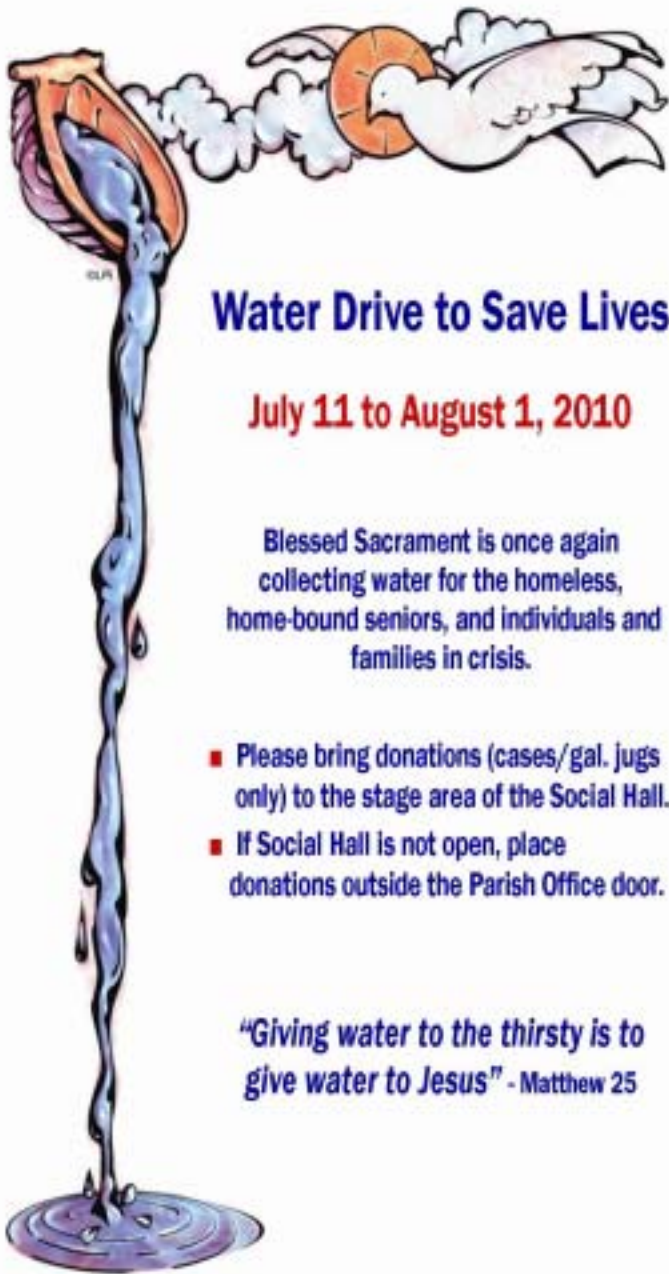
