# Parade Around the "Our Father"



## Pastor's Corner...

A certain amount of money and material possessions are necessary. Jesus' parable this weekend is not about need but about greed. The farmer was rich to begin with, but he still wasn't satisfied. Greed is like a fire – the more wood you pile on it, the hungrier it gets. One of the chief problems of our time is that people don't know when they are well off.

When the crow builds a nest in the forest, it occupies but a single branch. When a deer wants to satisfy its thirst, it drinks no more than it needs at that moment.

People have a craving for security. In biblical times, when famine was a recurrent threat, they sought security in stockpiling grain. In our times, they seek the stockpiling of money and possessions. People accumulate things and cling to them, because they give the illusion of security. But security cannot be found in possessions. It can be found only in God.

As well as security, people also seek self-worth in possessions. In our society, people are estimated by what they have. To have a lot is to be something. To have nothing is to be nothing.

Jesus said that rather than storing up treasures we should seek to make ourselves rich in the sight of God. What makes us rich in the sight of God is not what we own, or even what we've done, but who we are.

It is not possessions that are sinful but possessiveness. To be detached doesn't mean being indifferent or uninterested. It means to be non-possessive. Life is a gift to be grateful for, not a possession to cling to. A non-possessive life is a free life.

The only riches that are worth accumulating are the riches of the heart. A generous heart is a treasure. To have a generous heart is to be rich in the sight of God. Fear and

greed are the real enemies. The dread of hunger when the granary is full is the hunger which can never be satisfied.

2. The Bible says, "It is not good for man to be alone," and the Bible is always right.

And finally, the No. 1 reason why God created Eve:

1. When God finished making Adam, He stepped back and said, "I can do better than that."

## Liturgy Corner..

If you grew up in a family with another sibling, it is likely that at some point you or a brother or sister went to mom or dad and said something like, "Tell [put your sibling's name here] to share [toy, cake, cookie, TV-fill in the blank]." We've all done it, even if we're an only child and used the line on a school teacher or aunt or uncle when playing with a cousin. Most of us have an innate sense of fairness and justice. We want to be treated equitably. We grow up with aphorisms like "Fair is fair," "Take turns," and "Play by the rules." We appeal to authority (Mom, Dad, teacher, referee, judge) when we think we're being taken advantage of. Our expectation is that justice will prevail.

Civil trials often involve that quest for justice. An aggrieved party seeks an equitable outcome through a judgment against an offender. But justice alone does not guarantee solace. How many times have we heard in the news about a plaintiff who explains that it was not the court judgment that brought peace and resolution. Inevitably, they explain how they have found peace when they were able to bring themselves to forgive the offender. Many describe how the anger or pain in their hearts continued to interfere with their lives until they could put it aside by being reconciled.

The words of Jesus in the Gospel that "one's life does not consist of possessions" reflect this understanding. While compensatory and punitive damages help relieve an injustice, they do not resolve a situation completely. Only movement toward forgiveness and reconciliation can bring that about. It is not easy to do that, but our Christian experience acknowledges that it can be done, even if it takes years to accomplish. The hope is that we will be "rich in what matters to God" (Lk 12:21).

From the perspective of 4-pillar stewardship, it points out how we need to approach living these pillars with authenticity and a focus on discerning God's will.

**Hospitality** – Are we truly loving and open or do we only show what we want others to see?

**Prayer** – Do we pray without ceasing in a running conversation with our loving God, or is it just about Mass on Sunday?

**Formation** – Are we life-long learners, deepening our faith and sharing it with others or did we pretty much stop faith formation after high school?

**Service** – Are we standing in solidarity with the poor and the marginalized or do we let secular politics shade the practice of our faith?

When we ponder these questions, our touchstone of truth rests in discerning the difference between doing God's will or feeding the vanities of the world.

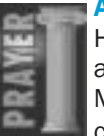
