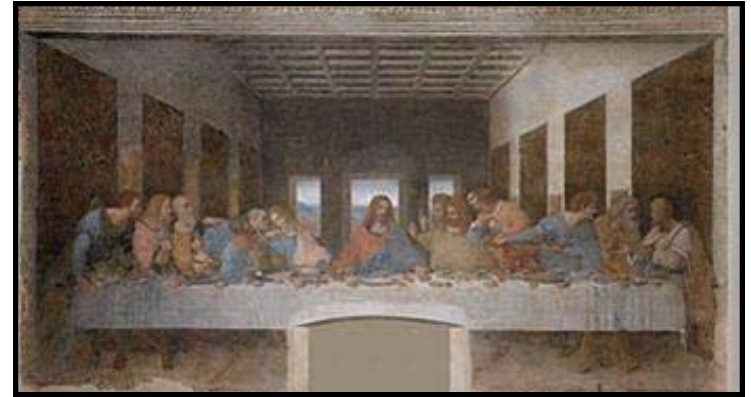
Holy Thursday: Mass of the Lord's Supper – 7:00 pm, in the Church

The Living Last Supper

The Living Last Supper was written by Rev. *Ernest Emurian* in 1954, and has been performed many times by Christian communities including Catholic parishes. The Living Last Supper specifically portrays the reaction given by each apostle when Jesus said that one of them would betray Him. All twelve apostles have different reactions to the news, with various degrees of anguish and shock.

The apostles' soliloquies, interspersed with musical selections, encourage us to look within ourselves during Lent to re-examine how we continue to contribute to Christ's suffering. As the Supper nears its end, the group shares the precious gift of Christ's Body and Blood and then heads out to the Garden of Gethsemane where His Passion begins.

Our Living Last Supper production is being narrated by Cheryl Segneri who is also the producer. Cheryl has been a member of our parish for three and a half years. In her parish in Illinois, she was a parish council president, taught religious education, was a lector and Eucharistic Minister, as well as a choir member and cantor. She and her husband, Wayne, were also involved in Marriage Preparation. She was a narrator for the Living Last Supper for many years and is excited about bringing this event to our parish.

Our presentation is being directed by Wayne Segneri, who is also playing the part of the apostle Andrew. Wayne brings over 30 years of experience as a stage actor and director in community theater. He welcomes this opportunity to bring the Living Last Supper to life.

The music selections were prepared and directed by Michael Barta. Mike has served as Director of Liturgy and Music for the Community of the Blessed Sacrament since June of 2008, and has been in professional liturgical ministry in Texas, California and Arizona since 1983. With college degrees from Texas A&M, The University of Texas, California State University, Fresno, and Fresno Pacific University, Mike brings a wealth of knowledge to his music skills of singing, conducting, guitar and piano. Mike and his wife Terez have 6 children and 6 grandchildren with one more on the way. In addition to music, Mike enjoys hiking, camping and gardening.



Jim Pfungst (James the Less)

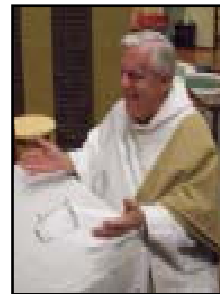
Rich Czerwinski (James, brother of John)
