For parents registering their children for the 2010-11 school year, please note: In order to receive the school’s reduced Catholic Tuition Rate, your pastor must determine whether your family meets the criteria set by your parish for *Registered, Active, Participating* members. The definition of registered, active, and participating varies by parish, but usually includes attending Mass regularly as well as contributing with an envelope to the offertory along with supporting the ministry life of the parish. If you have questions about your family’s status, please contact your pastor directly. (Note: All Diocesan high school students receiving the reduced tuition rate for the coming year must have their status verified by their home pastor before they can be registered as Catholic.)
